Traditional fishing communities have, through long years of interaction with fisheries resources, learned to manage such resources in sustainable ways, enabling them to survive over generations. There are numerous examples from around the world about how communities have managed their resources, resolved conflicts over resources, and shared their benefits, often through the mediation of traditional or customary institutions. Small-scale fishing communities have evolved mechanisms to ensure that the resources, livelihood opportunities and

revenues from the common property fisheries are spread as widely as possible within the whole community.
